We're completely BACK...on a whole NEW TRACK!

Post-pandemic, Wellwood has emerged with a fully hybrid model, combining in-person and virtual offerings. This allows us to better meet the needs of immune-compromised clients — as well as those who are unable to come to our physical spaces — whether that is due to geography, transportation, mobility, caregiving responsibilities, feeling too unwell to travel, or continuing to practice physical distancing for personal safety.

Our team is witnessing, firsthand, the drastic effects of pandemic-related delays in screening, testing, treatment and surgeries — significantly higher numbers, advanced stages of diagnoses, ongoing isolation, and far more complex needs.







This coming year will mark my 25th anniversary as Wellwood's Executive Director. It remains a tremendous privilege to serve you – our clients, volunteers, donors and community. I strive to demonstrate our organizational values on a daily basis, as well as our commitment to collaboration, accessibility, inclusivity and transparency – and I promise to keep checking my own "best before date" to ensure that I never, ever bring less than my ALL.

As the cover of this report says, the profile of our "newly-diagnosed" clients has changed significantly to "newly-diagnosed at an advanced stage." We continue to see unprecedented anxiety and isolation, as well as a dramatic shift in comorbidities for clients. As a result, our volunteers are being called upon to manage much more complicated situations, and a crucial component of navigational assistance has expanded well beyond cancer resources.

This isn't about "tea and sympathy" – this is about giving concrete tools to empower people on their journey... or fight... or battle. (The metaphor each chooses is as unique as they are.)

They need us, more than ever.

I am so grateful that you support our work, especially now, during ongoing uncertain times for small charities. We receive no funding from government, hospitals or national cancer organizations. We rely on donations, as well as grants from local foundations, to do what we do. Your gift helps to keep cancer support in Hamilton.

We need you, more than ever, too.

In 2000, we received a grant from Ontario Trillium Foundation to hire for a half-time position for programs and volunteer management. Norma Frankoff, a local leader in the not-for-profit sector specializing in Board development, decided to apply. She said that it was because she wanted to be involved in the early stages of something important, meaningful and special for this community. Her role quickly evolved to more-thanfull-time as Director of Programs & Organizational Development.

A career highlight was being called to the stage when Wellwood was named the City's first ever Diversity Champion by Hamilton Centre for Civic Inclusion. Norma (shown here with our nominator, Dr. Gary Warner) has worked tirelessly leading this extremely essential work.

This past fall, Norma officially (semi) retired – but the good news is that she isn't leaving anytime soon. She has agreed to stay on, one day a week, to continue to mentor our staff team.

What an absolute gift and privilege it has been to be her colleague. On behalf of all of us at Wellwood – thank you, Norma, for everything you have given to our clients, volunteers and this community.









FINANCIAL NOTES:

These remain very challenging times for charities.

Ultimately, Wellwood's sustainability is largely due to the gift of time and talent provided by our team of 231 organizational and situational volunteers. All programs are volunteer-delivered, which keeps staffing costs to an absolute minimum.

Post-pandemic, volunteer engagement has been a very high priority. We were fortunate to receive a grant from Ontario Trillium Foundation's Resilient Communities Fund for a one-year staff position with this focus, an investment that now has demonstrated outcomes vital to our future.

The foundation of our revenue generation is the result of an endowment fund, invested in its entirety, providing annual income to support operating costs; however, it is just one-quarter of the money needed to run the organization.

The in-kind support provided by our community partners at Hamilton Health Sciences remains vital to our success. That said, <u>Wellwood is not government or hospital funded</u>, nor is it financed by user fees. We provide our programs at no cost to all who need them.

Donors are assured of exceptional return on investment due to the efficiency of our volunteer-delivered service model, and know that we are transparent, responsible, accountable custodians of your gifts.
